WHAT'S HAPPENING IN GREEN ISLAND

May 14, 2014

Dear Friends,

I finally get to start a letter and it isn't snowing. Yahoo!!!! But, along with the good weather comes the quality of life issues that surface when the nice weather makes its entry. That means noisy motorcycles, backyard fires (which there is a state ban on open fires) and doggie poop. But the most distressing issue so far this year is VANDALISM! In the last week we have had broken bleachers in the stadium, graffiti under the Collar City Bridge, broken tree limbs in the parks and the "mortal sin" of vandalizing the Gazebo. I had a passer-by call me on Mother's Day evening to tell me a group of kids were in the Gazebo and one of them was kicking out the posts in the railings. I was out the door in a flash, had the police on the cell phone and confronted the kids in the Gazebo. Of course everyone claimed innocence. One even had the nerve to tell me he was trying to kick the posts back in! Once the officers arrived, my husband and I began to scour the river bank and garbage cans to find the missing post. We were lucky and found it. Someone also broke off the locks and switches on the electrical boxes and they were charging their phones (that takes a lot of nerve to do the damage and then steal the electricity). The officers got a confession from one of the kids (after the others told the truth when they realized they would be charged too). The child is 12 years old so it will be referred to Family Court. Mark made all the necessary repairs to the Gazebo the next day. I told the kids involved that night that there would be zero tolerance for vandalism and when we catch anyone damaging any village property that we would prosecute to the fullest extent of the law. We work very hard to provide nice places for our residents to enjoy themselves and we don't have money to repair unnecessary vandalism. Parents and grandparents, PLEASE talk to your kids and explain to them the consequences of their actions. About an hour after all this occurred, a group of kids (I believe some of the same ones from earlier) were screaming vulgar obscenities at the top of their lungs and breaking the branches off the trees in the River Park. I went out and told them to watch their mouths and leave the trees alone. I went back in my house to do my dishes at the kitchen sink and this same group walked over Bleecker Street and two of the girls sat down and laid down in the middle of the road on George Street. I know they were just trying to "get my goat" but this was such a stupid and dangerous action that I couldn't believe they did it. Back out I went and made them get up from the road and get on the sidewalk. I went back in the house, closed my blinds and had a drink. It had been one heck of a Mother's Day! Before all this chaos, I had enjoyed a lovely day with my kids and grandchildren. It really is a shame that it was spoiled by a bunch of unruly children who should have been home enjoying Mother's Day with their own moms. Next year I am going out of town!

Please join us for our Memorial Day Parade on Thursday, May 22nd at 6:00 p.m. Our veterans and present day military have made tremendous sacrifices so

that we may live in freedom. Too often we take that freedom for granted. We need to show our appreciation to these men and women who have given us so much. Please line the streets on George and Arch and give them a "wave" of thanks. And if you can, join us at the Legnard-Curtin American Legion Post for a salute and some refreshments. Remember: "*Freedom isn't free.*"

Thank you to all who cooperated so well on Monday, May 12th for our street cleaning. I was amazed that as soon as I started to announce a street, people a block in front of me were running out of their homes to move their vehicles. I'm not sure if they were just well trained from all the snow removals we had this winter, if they had been recipients of a "ticket and tow" during the winter or if they were just anxious to see the winter dirt and grime disappear. I hope it was the latter of the three, but never the less, I am grateful for the cooperation. Also, a BIG thanks to Cohoes Mayor Primeau and DPW's Kenny Radliff and their staffs for the sweepers and help to make our village nice and clean. This is one more example of shared services and municipal cooperation that helps us to keep costs down. Thanks also to our own Tony, Rick and Corey from DPW and Officers Barker and Beaudoin from our PD for their efforts.
