RECREATION NEWS

A competitive interview process will be mandatory for all applicants. Applications are now available at the Village Office or with Mrs. Legault in the main office at Heatly School. All applications must be returned to the **VILLAGE OFFICE** on or before April 30th, no exceptions. Applicants must be 14 years old by July 1, 2015 to be eligible for employment.

STORMWATER COALITION OF ALBANY COUNTY

The Stormwater Coalition of Albany County was formed in 2008 via an inter-municipal agreement between 13 municipalities and the University of Albany. The Village of Green Island is a charter member and Executive Assistant to the Mayor, Sean Ward, has been Chairman of their Board of Directors since its inception. The purpose of the Coalition is to foster cooperation, achieve cost savings and to provide for the provision of joint shared services related to compliance with the NYSDEC SPDES Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4) Permit program and Federal Clean Water Act requirements. WHAT'S HAPPENING IN GREEN ISLAND

March 16, 2015

Dear Friends,

Well it looks like Mother Nature is willing to give us a taste of Spring. I honestly thought these snow piles would be here until May. I can't believe we got rid of so much snow in the last week. I am grateful it has been somewhat gradual because the last thing we need right now is a flood. Let's hope it keeps going in the right direction. As much as I hated losing an hour's sleep with daylight savings time, it is nice that it is still light out when you come home to eat dinner. But I will tell you what my favorite thing has been --- I got to get dressed one day without putting on my long johns. Now that is probably more information than you needed, but this winter has been so cold that I have been wearing long johns every day for the last 10 weeks (just to clarify that, I have more than one pair). I only used to wear them when I went out on snow removal, but I guess feeling so cold goes along with getting old. I am not a skinny woman, so putting on an extra layer of clothing certainly doesn't enhance my appearance, so I will be happy to pack those buggers away. But I won't do it yet, because I don't think the "Old Girl" is through with us yet. Maybe by next month's letter!

I think the thing I worry about most with things thawing out is what has happened underground with our infrastructure with the frost going so deep. We will need to do some serious assessments on our roads and determine what needs to be done. I will keep you posted, but don't expect the news to be good.

The end of March and the month of April are looking to be a busy time in the village. Our Village Budget Hearing is on April 2nd at the Municipal Center. The Recreation Department and the Senior Citizens are partnering on a Breakfast with the Easter Bunny on March 29th and Maggie is starting to accept applications for summer employment. Mike was also active in many other village groups throughout the years. And he never slowed down after retiring from GE. A graduate of RPI, he has been very active in their alumni group. And Mike has been a mentor to many, not just at RPI. He has been a steadfast mentor to me, especially since my father died. Whenever I go to him to bounce an idea, I know I will get an honest assessment and an intelligent answer. He has been an especially valuable asset in his years of service as a Trustee on the Board of the Green Island Power Authority. His engineering expertise has been invaluable. When an especially complicated mechanical issue will come up, I just say to Mike, "Dumb it down for me so I can understand it" and he has a talent for explaining it in a simple way for all to understand. Some engineers intentionally keep it complicated so you won't understand. Mike makes sure you will understand. He is a very intelligent, unassuming, dedicated, charming, funny, devoted and loving man. Our community is very lucky to have him – and I am especially lucky to call him my friend and mentor.
