NEWS FROM THE ASSESSOR

There are exemptions available to those senior citizens that are or will be 65 during the year that they are filing for the exemption -2016. The exemptions require that one of the owners meet the age requirement, and that the home is the primary residence.

New and renewal applications for the ENHANCED STAR EXEMPTION ON THE 2016 ROLL will be based on the applicant's 2014 income. The NEW INCOME LIMIT of \$84,550 will be based on the Adjusted Gross Income of the 2014 Income Tax Return.

The **Senior Citizen** exemption for County and/or Village tax purposes is available for those 65 and older with an annual income not to exceed \$37,400 for county purpose and \$14,700 for village purposes. This exemption is based on the **Total Gross Income for 2015**.

If you are eligible for the Senior Citizen Exemption you will automatically receive the Enhanced STAR. However, if you are eligible for the Enhanced STAR you may NOT be eligible for the Senior Citizen exemption. <u>They are two separate exemptions</u>.

ALL EXEMPTION APPLICATIONS MUST BE FILED BY MARCH 1, 2016.

If you are in the Income Verification Program you have received a letter to confirm your exemption. If you receive this confirmation by mail you do not have to reapply for the Enhanced STAR exemption. All other applicants have received their renewal applications by mail.

WHAT'S HAPPENING IN GREEN ISLAND

January 18, 2016

Dear Friends,

I hope you all had a wonderful Christmas. I got to spend some time with my kids and grandchildren – and it was wonderful! It was nice with the holiday falling on a Friday because it seemed like Christmas was three days long. But it didn't take long to get "back in the saddle" and get back to work. I want to thank Mother Nature for the best present --- no snow! We have been very lucky this year and I hope it keeps up. It is snowing as I am writing this, but I don't think it will amount to much (famous last words). We are better than half way through January, so whatever we get now won't be here that long. If every winter was like this one so far, I wouldn't mind winter at all. But I quickly recall last winter and it wasn't nice. It seemed like everything came on nights and weekends and our poor guys on the salter and plows were going 24/7. As bad as the snow and ice may be, nothing is as bad as the massive water main break that Troy had yesterday. I am glad we don't have any pipes that big. We have had our share of water breaks, but I have never seen anything like that. From all accounts they handled it well. God bless them!

Back to business. We had our first Community Police meeting on Tuesday, January 12th and it was great. We had a pretty good turnout for the first meeting, but I hope the word spreads and we get a lot more folks for the next one. Officer Lou Perfetti and Chief Parker did a great job. Lou explained a lot about how we as residents play such an important part in helping the officers get the job done. Kevin Demarest, who is one of our officers but also works full time for the Sheriff's Department in communications, gave a pretty intensive overview of the 911 system and how it works. One of the hardest things to get residents to do is use the 911 system. I have a hard time using it myself. I grew up in an era where you didn't call 911 unless it was a matter of "life and death." That has changed and we are encouraged to use 911 for everything and let the dispatcher "triage" where the call should go and how to handle it. But there are still some people who won't call 911, so they have given us a "non-emergency" number to call and report anything that is not a true emergency. That number is 765-2352. We hope this will make people more comfortable with calling the police. The Police have always gotten very valuable information in the past from residents who see things in their neighborhoods that don't seem quite right. Unfortunately, most of those people aren't passing on that information anymore because they are uncomfortable calling the Sheriff's dispatchers. So, we now have an anonymous "DRUG TIP LINE" number to call that goes directly to our Green Island Police Station and you can leave a message with the information. Only Chief Parker and Officer Perfetti will have access to this line and they will determine how to handle the information. It is an anonymous line, but if you are comfortable leaving your name and number, it may be helpful if the Chief or Lou need more information. Either way, we need your eyes and ears to pass along anything you encounter that seems not quite right. Don't worry if it turns out to be nothing. It's always better to be safe than sorry. The "DRUG TIP LINE" number is 655-7971. We also have

a phone tree line if you would like to leave a message for a particular officer. That number is 765-2351. We are working on getting some magnets with these new numbers that you can put on your refrigerator so it is always handy (I have put the numbers at the bottom of this page so you will have them until the magnets come in.) But PLEASE remember, you can always call 911 if you don't have these other numbers with you. We will let you know when the next meeting is scheduled and hope you will join us. The success of Community Policing truly depends on the partnership between the residents and the officers in our department. Please help us make it a success! I'm halfway down my second page, so I better shorten my chatter because I have a lot more to cover.

THANK YOU to everyone who was so generous for our "Giving Tree" and food pantry for the holidays. Your kindness made a big difference in the way many families were able to celebrate Christmas.

I feel like spring is in the air because the other newsletter has info about Little League! Please check it out.
