The purpose of the Coalition is to foster cooperation and to provide for the provision of joint shared services related to compliance with the NYSDEC SPDES Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4) Permit program and Federal Clean Water Act requirements. WHAT'S HAPPENING IN GREEN ISLAND

February 15, 2016

Dear Friends,

I hope you all had a nice Valentine's Day. I had great plans for spending a relaxed and romantic day with my Honey, but relaxed wasn't in the cards because we had frozen water pipes in two places. Frozen pipes make me VERY nervous. You may recall my account of what happened in the funeral home two years ago when a pipe on the second floor burst. I didn't want to go through that again so my Valentine and I suited up in warm clothes, armed ourselves with blow driers and headed to the problems. After success with the first one, I headed to the funeral home while Mark packed up our "tools." I slithered into a two and a half foot crawl space, blow drier in one hand and a flashlight in the other, and started to warm the pipes. Problem is you are never quite sure just where the freeze is in the pipe so it can take a while --- and it did. Finally I could hear the water start to run in the sink on the first floor ---- success --- and then the pipe I was working on let loose in about six spots and started spraying all over me. There I lay, in a freezing dirty crawl space, water spraying all over me --- and I have a live electrical lead with a blow drier in my hand. You never saw a 64 year old woman move so fast. I came out feet first, maneuvering over heating ducts and insulation and doing contortions I did not know my body could do. I was not going to "meet my maker" by getting electrocuted in that crawl space. Can you imagine the job our poor firefighters would have had getting me out of there? We isolated the break so the water stopped spraying. I thought we were done, only to find out the hot water pipe was still frozen. So I had to crawl back in the now very wet crawl space, blow drier and flashlight in hand, to try to thaw the other pipe and not get zapped at the same time. It all worked out. And now the weatherman says it is going to be 52 degrees tomorrow!!!! How can we go from a wind chill of 40 below to a high of 52 less than two days? That's crazy weather --- BUT AT LEAST THERE IS **NO SNOW!!!!!** I hope I get to say that again next month when I write my letter. I also hope we don't find any water main breaks after this cold snap. They never show their ugly heads until it warms up so this week will be the test. Keep your fingers crossed.

Well the Police Department got the magnets for you with the emergency numbers that I mentioned in last month's letter. Only problem is we are going to have to hand stuff all the bills, letters and magnets because the machine can't handle them. I think the Chief is going to owe the ladies a couple of pizzas for their extra efforts. How about it Chief? I like mushrooms and peppers! The Green Island Senior Citizens Club will be sponsoring a spaghetti supper fundraiser in honor of the late Mike Cocca. Mike's family had requested memorial contributions to the Seniors when Mike passed away last July and the Seniors received many donations. Now they are going to use some of that money to "grow" the donations. And what better way to honor Mike than a spaghetti supper. He worked many, many suppers at the Italian Club through the decades. He was usually tending bar with the other male members while the ladies did the hard work in the kitchen. I can see Mike up in heaven shaking his finger at me for that comment!
