# OUTDOOR BURNING BANNED UNTIL MAY 15<sup>TH</sup>

Fire Chief Robert Bourgeois has announced a New York State ban on outdoor burning until **May 15<sup>th</sup>**. Cooking grills with a flame lower than 6 inches and with an attached cover are **EXEMPT**. Please visit our website as noted above for further details and updates.

#### STREET CLEANING

Street Cleaning will be held in the Village on Thursday, May 18<sup>th</sup> starting at 8:00 a.m. This year the street cleaning will be conducted like our snow removal. The Police Department will travel the streets and announce the time that street cleaning operations will begin. If you do not hear the announcement, it will not be considered a legitimate excuse for not moving your vehicle. Spring Clean-Up will be held on the following Saturdays in May: May 6<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup> and 20<sup>th</sup> from 10:00 a.m. to 2:00 p.m. at the D.P.W. Garage on Cohoes Avenue. This service is for *GREEN ISLAND RESIDENTS ONLY* and will be limited to one pickup truck load or two SUV/station wagon loads for the *MONTH*, not each week. Due to increasing costs of running this program a minimal fee of \$10 per car load will now be charged. Participants must pay at the Village Office during regular office hours before the date of the event. Payment cannot be accepted at the site. # WHAT'S HAPPENING IN GREEN ISLAND

Hope you are enjoying this nice weather. This is the first time in a long time that I am not writing as the snow was coming down. It was 85 degrees yesterday as we celebrated Easter. I hope it stays nice – and that means we need to do Spring Cleanup! We will be sweeping the roads on Thursday, May 18th starting at 8:00 a.m. That means everyone must move their vehicles when their street is announced. PLEASE cooperate so we can get the job done quickly. If you don't move, it is a \$50 ticket, so please listen for the announcements. You can also do a little Spring Cleaning at your home and get rid of stuff you don't need any more by bringing it to the DPW garage on May 6<sup>th</sup>, 13<sup>th</sup> or 20<sup>th</sup> from 10a.m. to 2 p.m. Each residence is allowed one pickup truck or two carloads for the month at the nominal fee of \$10 per load and fee must be paid at the Village Office in advance. Please note that you cannot pay at the DPW garage on the day you drop off your trash and that this service is for Green Island residents only and trash must be from their Green Island residence (that means you can't clean out your kid's garage in another town). I hate to have to say all this stuff, but you would not believe what some people will do and if people continue to abuse this service, we will be forced to discontinue it because it is quite costly.

We will be hosting our semi-annual Red Cross Blood Drive on Friday, May 12<sup>th</sup> from 1 to 6 p.m. at the Community Center at 5 George Street.
