The purpose of the Coalition is to foster cooperation and to provide for the provision of joint shared services related to compliance with the NYSDEC SPDES Municipal Separate Storm Sewer Systems (MS4) Permit program and Federal Clean Water Act requirements. CODE ENFORCEMENT

New and existing residential and commercial buildings must have approved address numbers, building numbers, or approved building identification placed in a position that is plainly legible and visible from the street or road fronting the property. These numbers shall contrast with their background. Address numbers must be Arabic Numbers or alphabet letters. According to the International Fire Code numbers must be a minimum of 4" high with a minimum width of .5 inch.
