#### **ANNUAL FOOD DRIVE**

The Annual Food Drive to benefit the Green Island Food Pantry will be on Saturday, October 19<sup>th</sup> starting at 10:00 a.m. Residents are asked to contribute whatever they can to help the needy families in our community. (Please refrain from donating expired items). We are in need of ALL items at this time, in addition to the traditional items for the upcoming holiday baskets; stuffing, instant mashed potatoes, corn, peas, green beans, cranberry sauce, sweet potatoes, turkey gravy. THERE WILL BE NO BAG DROP OFF. Please use whatever bag you deem necessary to handle your donations.

#### **POLICE DEPARTMENT NEWS**

In preparation for snow plowing and snow removal, all inoperative or unregistered motor vehicles, recreational vehicles, dumpsters and all types of trailers must be removed from village streets by November 1<sup>st</sup>, 2019. All illegally parked motor vehicles, recreational vehicles, dumpsters and trailers will be ticketed and towed at the owner's expense.

#### **SNOW PLOWING AND REMOVAL**

The streets are generally plowed in the following order. However, this procedure is "subject to change" based upon various emergency conditions, which might arise.

All vehicles which are not moved for snow plowing operations will be ticketed and towed. The fine is \$50.00, the fee for towing is \$75.00 and there will be a storage fee of \$5.00 per day after the first 24 hours. All fines and fees must be paid at the Green Island Village Offices before the vehicle is released. There will be an additional charge if special equipment is required to move a vehicle from the street.

Residents who are on vacation, work out-of-town or who leave their cars on the streets for any reason should make arrangements with a friend or neighbor to move their car for snow plowing operations.

The Department of Public Works does an excellent job of keeping our streets open for travel and emergencies until the storm ends and the regular snow plowing operation can be carried out. Some people who have had their cars towed during the past storms

have complained that they have moved their car to streets they thought had been plowed and find out that they have not been completely plowed. In order to avoid this problem, <u>PLEASE CHECK WITH A POLICE OFFICER</u>, OR SOMEONE IN CHARGE OF THE <u>SNOW PLOWING OPERATIONS</u>, <u>BEFORE YOU PARK YOUR CAR ON ANY STREET YOU THINK HAS BEEN PLOWED</u>.

The Police Department travels the streets to announce the time that snowplowing operations will begin. If you do not hear the announcement, it will not be considered a legitimate excuse for not moving your vehicle. The Village will also be using the Emergency Alert System to notify residents. Forms to register can be picked up and dropped off at the Village Office. #### **HYDRANT FLUSHING**

Hydrants will be flushed in Green Island and Maplewood on Wednesday, November 6<sup>th</sup>, Thursday, November 7<sup>th</sup> and Friday, November 8<sup>th</sup>. A slight discoloration in the water may occur and washing of laundry is not recommended during this time.

#### RABIES VACCINATION CLINIC

The Rabies Vaccination Clinic for dogs, cats and ferrets has been arranged by the Albany County Department of Health in cooperation with the Capital District Veterinary Medical Society. On Saturday, November 16<sup>th</sup>, 2019 from 1:00 – 2:30 p.m. for cats and ferrets and 2:30 p.m. – 4:00 p.m. for dogs at the Public Works Garage, Cohoes Avenue.

All dogs, cats and ferrets must be on leashes or in carriers. A record of prior vaccination will be required for a three-year immunization. If no record is present, a one-year vaccination certification will be issued. The clinic is open to any Albany County resident. Any inquiry can be directed to Division of Environmental Health Services at 518-447-4620 or 518-447-4625. There will be an \$8.00 donation per animal.

### What To Do After a Water Main Break or Hydrant Flushing:

After experiencing a water main break or after periodic hydrant flushing, the water system is flushed and disinfected by the Water and Sewer Department to the extent possible. In most cases you will not notice any difference in your water, though there is a chance that you may have air in the water pipes or notice a discoloration of the water. Natural mineral scale is on the inside of the pipes, and changes in the flow of water (such as during a water main break or flushing) often cause mineral scale to slough off and discolor the water or produce particulate matter. These mineral compounds pose no health threat.

Following a water main break or flushing, the Water Department recommends you flush the **COLD** water lines in your home or business. It will cost you pennies to take this important step.

- 1. Begin with the highest tap (faucet) without an aerator (a bathtub spigot is preferred) in your home, and then open other faucets one at a time, moving from your highest floor to your lowest floor. If the dwelling is one story, use the fixture closest to where the water service enters the building.
- 2. After five (5) to fifteen (15) minutes, or until the water is clear and any air in the line is depleted, turn off your faucets and tub spigot(s) in reverse order, from lowest to highest.
- 3. If the water does not clear, wait thirty (30) minutes and flush the COLD water lines again.
- 4. Following restoration of water service, check your toilets for any leaks. The temporary change in water pressure may have caused the toilet flapper to seat improperly after water has been restored.
- > Do not use discolored water for any purposes that require clean water, such as preparing food and beverages, medical and dental procedures, and laundry.
- > Do not flush the cold water through a faucet or tap (such as a refrigerator water line) that has a filter connected to it, or the sediment may clog your filter.
- > Do not use a hot water tap because it could draw sediment into your hot water tank.
