RECREATION NEWS

The Summer Park Program will officially begin on Monday, June 30th. The parents or guardians of any child wishing to use our facilities this summer are strongly encouraged to fill out an emergency contact form. The information provided will help our staff notify a parent or guardian in an emergency. A contact form can be picked up and dropped off at the Paine Street Park or the Village Office during operating hours. The form can also be found on the Village website at https://villageofgreenisland.com/village/parks-recreation/. PLEASE NOTE: The Village of Green Island does not provide direct childcare services. The Summer Park Program is not a registered daycare or structured program.

Save the dates for the following events happening this summer:

<u>Bike Rodeo</u> –Thursday, July 10th. Please bring your bike and bike helmet to the park by 12:30 p.m.

<u>Free Lunch Program</u> – Free lunch will be provided daily at 11:00 a.m. starting June 30th through August 20th.

The <u>Summer Concert Series</u> will begin Wednesday, July 9th, from 6:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m. There are **FREE** concerts every Wednesday through August 27th. The concerts are held in the Hudson River Park, just north of Heatly School. **RAIN LOCATION** is the east side of Hudson Avenue, under the bridge.

The <u>Sprinkler Pad</u> schedule will coincide with the summer program, which is scheduled to begin on Monday, June 30^{th} – Thursday, August 28^{th} . The hours of the summer program are 10:00 a.m. – 5:00 p.m. Weather permitting the sprinklers will be on some evenings from 5:00 p.m. – 8:00 p.m.

The **Albany County Department of Recreation** and the **Green Island Recreation Department** will sponsor a basketball camp for kids ages 6-14 at the Paine Street Park. The camp will be held on Saturdays, starting July 12^{th} - August 23rd from 9am-11am. The camp is **FREE** for all Albany County residents. Please register at https://albanycounty.com/recreation

WATER DEPARTMENT

The Water Department will be working with a contractor, GPR, on a Water Leak Detection Project beginning the week of June 23rd. As part of the project, representative will be throughout the Village inspecting fire hydrants and other water infrastructure to check for potential leaks. All representatives will be properly identified and working in coordination with the Village. If you have any serious concerns, contact the Green Island Police Department at 518-765-2352 or by calling 911.

NEWS FROM CODE ENFORCEMENT

According to the Village Code, a homeowner must maintain grass and weed growth on their property, from the curb inward. Failure to do so may result in legal action. If the Building Inspector orders the owner to clean the property and the owner refuses, the Village will hold a public hearing. If the owner does not respond, the Village DPW will be directed to clean up the property and a hefty bill will be levied onto the property taxes. The Building Inspector will conduct a survey and will notify homeowners if they have buildings that are subject to this ruling. Please cooperate by making our community a more attractive place to reside.

REMINDER – DOGS AND POOPER SCOOPER LAW

A REMINDER TO ALL PET OWNERS - It is illegal to bring any animal, except for a guide or therapy dog, into any <u>public park</u>. This includes ALL parks, the Green Island Little League and Veteran's Memorial Stadium. Cleaning up after your animal is not only the right things to do – it's the LAW. Please be a responsible pet owner and carry a bag when walking your animal. The Village has a Pooper Scooper Law in place requiring all pet owners to clean up after their pets in public and private spaces, including sidewalks, and grassy areas. If fecal matter washes into the storm drains it could go directly to the river, which would be a violation of the "Clean Water Act". If you wish to walk your dog, make sure you are prepared to clean up after them. We are also receiving complaints, and the Police have issued tickets to violators who allow or fail to secure their animals (dogs) from running at large. Please make sure dogs are secured in fenced areas or if out for a walk with a responsible owner/handler, make sure the dog is on a leash. Lastly, we have also heard complaints about dogs that are habitually barking. This is a violation of our Local Law. Violators are subject to fines.

RECREATIONAL AND OTHER BACKYARD FIRES

This time of year, residents like to have small backyard fires. Typically, it isn't an issue if residents keep a small manageable fire in a safe area of their property and communicate with neighbors in a respectful manner.

If there is an issue, and when police and fire personnel are called, the NYS Fire Code is clear that a fire is prohibited if the burning is "offensive or objectionable because of smoke or odor emissions.....". The Code also states that "Recreational fires shall not be conducted within 25 feet of a structure or combustible material.....", and that "Portable outdoor fireplaces shall be used in accordance with the manufacturer's instructions and shall not be operated within 15' of a structure or combustible material." If our personnel are called, they will enforce the law, most likely making you extinguish the fire immediately. You may also receive a citation. Please be a good neighbor and don't allow yourself to be put into that situation. Thank you for your cooperation. LANDLORDS, PLEASE SHARE THIS INFORMATION WITH YOUR TENANTS.
